NORDSTREAM: AN (ALMOST) PERFECT TRAP

The historical account you are about to read was written by a geographer. Its ambition goes far beyond the simple localization of events. Instead, it sheds light on what place has brought to societies throughout history. Geographers usually make a profession of studying and interpreting the places of contemporary societies; the aim here, in short, is to make use of their tools by transferring them to an understanding of the past. Even if humans have invented strategies to reduce the geographical distances between them, whether through increasingly efficient modes of transportation and communication, or by concentrating the maximum number of activities in a minimum amount of space (so we call a city), every society can name what is near and what is far.

Christian Grataloup is known as the most historical of geographers. A doctor in geography, he has taught at the Université Paris Cité. As a specialist in the field of geohistory, he has contributed to numerous publications, including bestsellers such as *The Worldwide Historical Atlas* [L'Atlas historique Mondial] (Les Arènes, 2019), *The Atlas of the Earth* [L'Atlas de la Terre] (Les Arènes, 2022) and *The Invention of the Continents and Oceans* [L'Invention des continents et des océans] (Larousse, 2020).

Where do our most enduring prejudices come from and why do they continue to thrive? 40 historians provide some answers.

Prejudice is an opinion, a preconceived idea or a judgement which is usually negative. The book's editors, Xavier Mauduit and Jeanne Guérout, asked 40 historians who are all experts on a historical period, geographical region or specialism to identify and analyse a specific prejudice and explain when and how it first emerged, how it has evolved and why it is still present today. What is the explanation behind why we tend to think women who wear perfume are dangerous, Japanese tend to be suicidal, Chinese people eat dogs, and the French are arrogant?

Jeanne Guérout is a professional historian and journalist. She is French-German and has worked for various national media outlets in Berlin and Paris (Arte, Le Monde, Die Tageszeitung, AFP). She is co-author of *Jours de guerre* (Les Arènes) and *Comme un Allemand en France* (L'Iconoclaste). She currently contributes to the radio programme 'Concordance des temps' on the French public radio channel France Culture.

Xavier Mauduit is a French university lecturer and has a PhD in history. His thesis on the house of Emperor Napoleon III won the Mérimée Prize in 2013. He worked for many years at the French public radio channel France Inter. Since 2017 he has been a regular fixture on the current affairs show '28 minutes' on the European culture TV channel Arte, and he currently hosts 'Le Cours de l'histoire' on France Culture.
